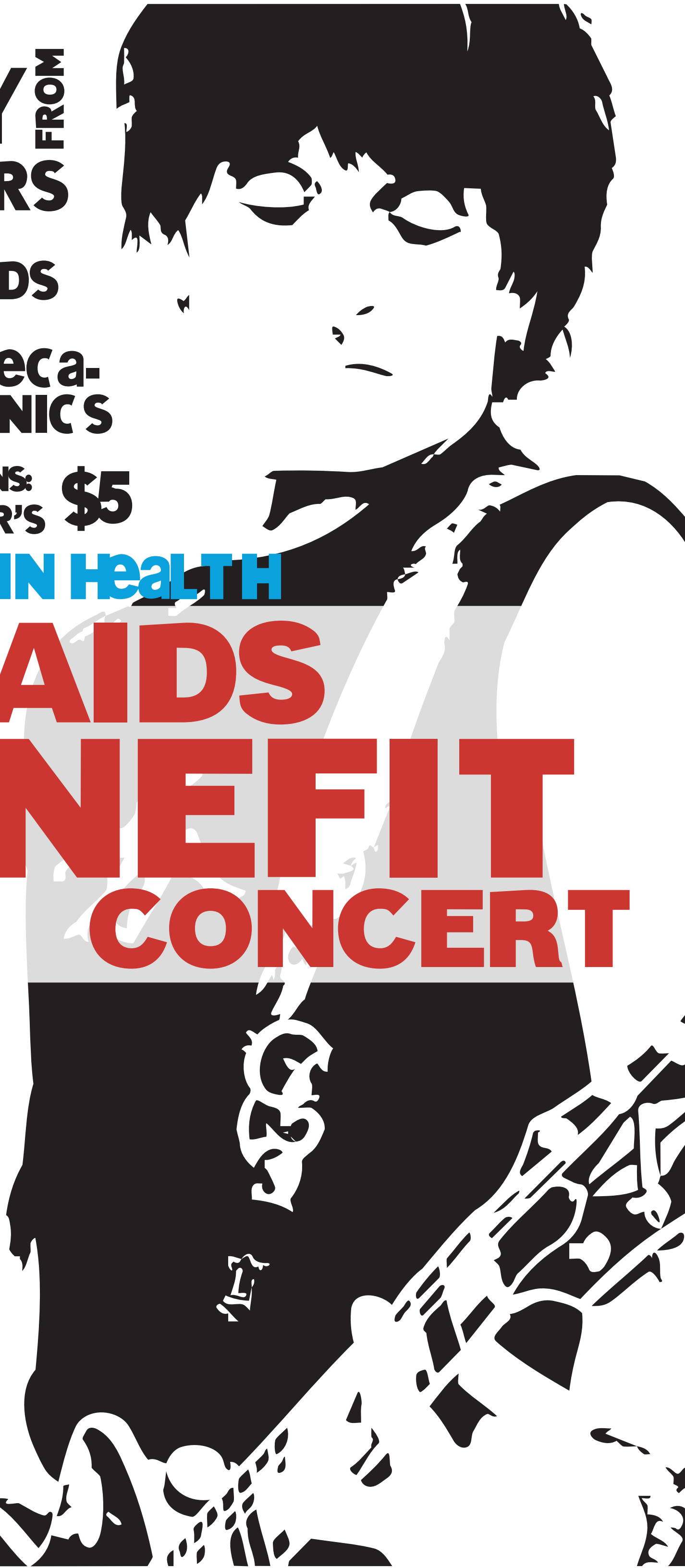

Top 5 Reasons to Work for a Non-Profit

- 5 1 in 12 Americans works for a non-profit.**
The sector itself contributes to over 5% of the GDP, and the inception rate of non-profits is increasing faster than that of private businesses.*
- 4 Non-profits offer you more leadership opportunities.**
Because non-profits are typically smaller, employees have the opportunity to fulfill many different roles - coordinator, publicist, PR, supervisor, advisor, etc.

Moosilauke Ravine Lodge

Located on the slopes of Mount Moosilauke and the final destination of DOC First-Year Trips, the Lodge offers hot meals, restful bunkrooms, square-dancing, and wilderness medical training classes from May to mid-October. Second College Grant

The Grant is a large tract of beautiful forest in northern NH owned by Dartmouth. Managed for sustainable timber harvesting, it also provides opportunities for hiking, berry picking, biking, birdwatching, canoeing, hunting, bushwhacking, skiing, and snowshoeing. It includes three of the DOC Cabins and is often the destination of DOC/OPO trips.

Dartmouth Skiway



Located only a short 20 minute drive from Hanover in Lyme, the Skiway offers exciting slopes for those of all experience levels. PE classes are held each winter term, and a bus makes regular runs from the Green to the Skiway during season. Dartmouth Cross Country Ski Center

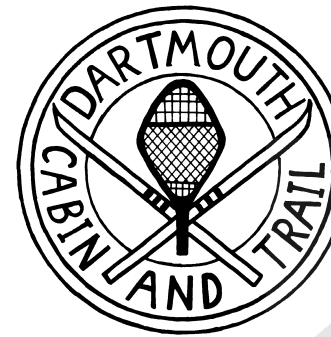

Ledyard Canoe Club

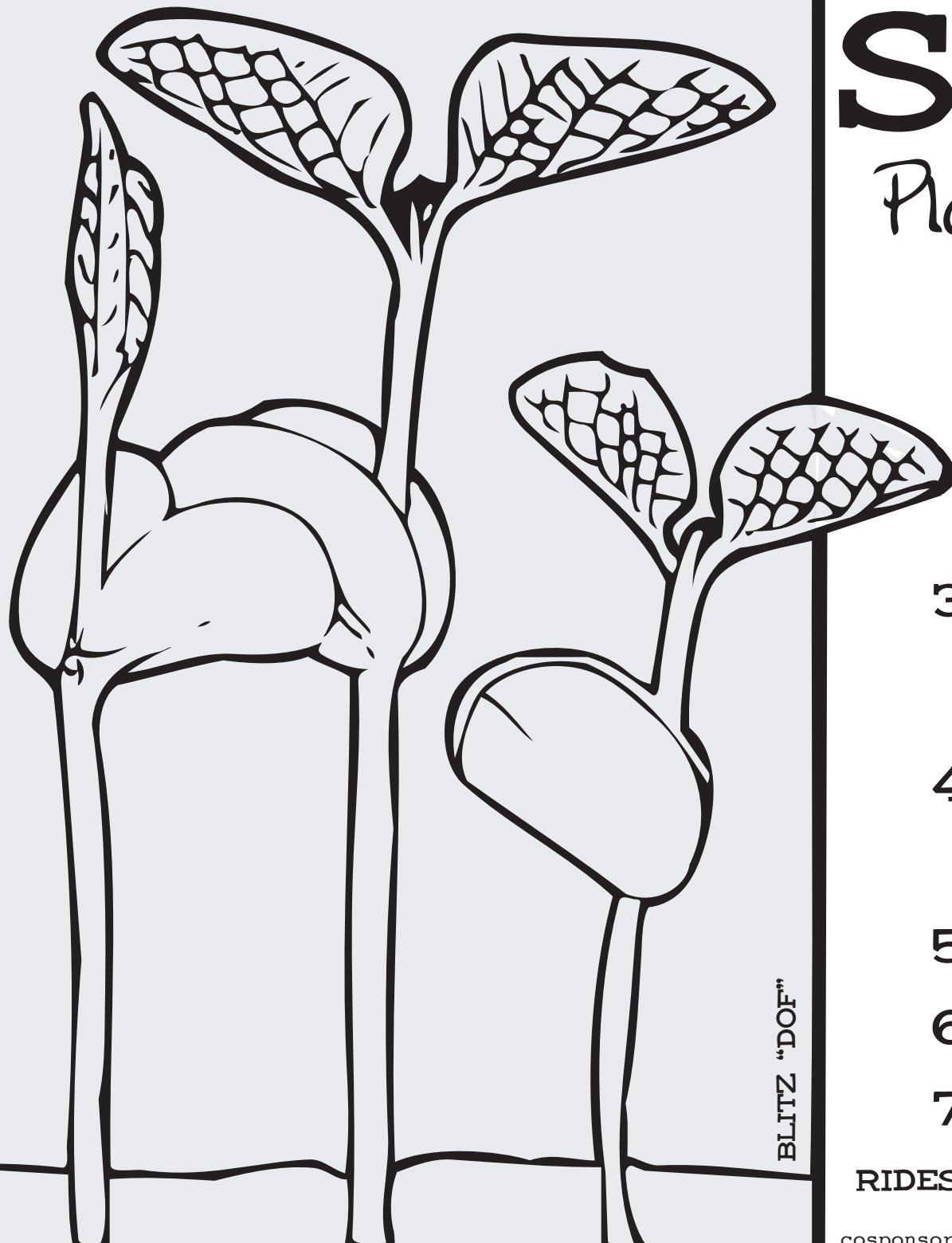
